Eligibility

GPA Requirement	There is no minimum GPA requirement to participate in the exchange program. However, students must meet the standards set by their home institution to study abroad.
Language Requirement	<p>Courses taught in English Students do not have to submit proof of English Language Proficiency. However, students from non-English speaking countries are recommended to have English proficiency scores equivalent to or higher than TOEFL IBT 79 (PBT550) or IELTS 6.5.</p> <p>Courses taught in Korean Students do not have to submit proof of Korean Language proficiency. However, it is highly recommended that students have Korean Proficiency level equivalent to or higher than TOPIK level 4 in order to take courses offered in Korean.</p>

Nomination & Application Process

Nomination	<p>Students must officially be nominated by their home institution in order to be eligible to apply. Each institution will be given a user ID and password for Sogang's online nomination system. <u>Nominations sent by email are not accepted.</u> http://goabroadoia.sogang.ac.kr/index.do Students will receive application instructions to the e-mail address registered by their home institution upon nomination so please make sure to register the correct e-mail address that the student uses.</p>
Application	<p>① When officially nominated by their home institution, students will be given access to Sogang's application system by e-mail. (E-mail will be sent to student's e-mail address registered by their home institution)</p> <p>② Students should access Sogang's application system with the user ID and password provided in the e-mail they receive. Acceptance	<p>Acceptance packages will be sent to student's home institution. Students coming for the fall semester will receive acceptance packages around early June and for the spring semester around early December. Acceptance package will include the following documents that students will need for visa application.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Certificate of Admission • Certificate of Business Registration of Sogang University • Letter of Acceptance

Level of Study	Both undergraduate and graduate depending on exchange agreement
Course Load per Semester	Undergraduate: 9 – 15 credits Graduate: 3 – 15 credits If students need to take additional credits, they can do so with a formal request from their home university coordinator. <i>* In general, courses at Sogang are three-credit courses. 1 Credit hour indicates 16 classroom contact hours and 32 self study hours in a semester.</i>
Courses taught in English	About 20-30% of the course are taught in English. Students can take courses across all majors with an exception to courses that are restricted to exchange students. Undergraduate students are not allowed to take graduate courses. However, graduate students can take both undergraduate and graduate courses.

Registration for these courses is very competitive so <u>students must be aware that they are not guaranteed requested courses</u>. It is highly advised that students be flexible with their course selections. For courses offered in the Art & Technology department, priority is given to students who come from an institution that has a separate departmental agreement with our A&T department due to class size restrictions.</i>
Course Registration	Course registration is done online on a <u>first-come, first-served</u> basis. Specific dates for course registration will be announced to students by email. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fall semester: mid/ end of July • Spring semester: mid/ end of January
Transcript	Transcripts will be issued about a month and a half after the end of the semester. 2 copies of the transcript will be sent to student’s home university. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fall semester: early February • Spring semester: early August

Korean Language Course

Overview	<p>The Office of International Affairs offers scholarships to exchange students who wish to take Korean language course at Sogang's Korean Language Education Center (KLEC). The scholarship covers the tuition fee for the Korean language course and the amount of scholarship differs depending on the course that students choose to take.</p>										
Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Intensive Course (KAP200): Full scholarship is offered to exchange students Tuition fee waived but deposit payment required Evening Course (KGP60): Partial scholarship (appx.50%) USD300 tuition fee charged <i>Students are responsible for other fees such as textbooks for both courses.</i> <i>Scholarship for Korean language course is only offered during the regular semesters (fall & spring). Students must register and pay tuition directly to KLEC if they wish to take Korean language course during the summer and winter.</i>

Transcripts that student submits upon application will be used to determine the student's academic major/minor. Students who study East Asian Studies or International Studies with a focus on Korea must submit a recommendation letter to enroll in KAP200. There is a deposit payment of USD300 to enroll in KAP200. This deposit will be returned to students at the end of the semester if students meet the minimum attendance requirement. Students are required to attend more than 80% of classes. Students with other academic majors can take KAP200 but they are not subject to the scholarship offered by Sogang OIA thus will have to pay full tuition. Students who take KAP200 must register for a regular course (3 credits) from the university to maintain their status as an exchange student. Students are required to make the necessary deposit or tuition payment within the designated registration period to be able to take the course.</p>

Visa / Immigration

Visa to Korea	<p>Exchange students have to apply for a visa (D-2-6) <u>prior to</u> their arrival in Korea. Students need to take the documents included in their acceptance package to the local Korean Embassy or Consulate and apply for visa.</p> <p>Required documents for visa application</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Certificate of Admission• Letter of Acceptance• Certificate of Business Registration of Sogang University <p>Additional documents may be required depending on the student's place of residence. Please contact the local Korean Embassy or Consulate and check the documents required for visa application.</p> <p>It is strongly recommended that students plan ahead and apply for their visa as soon as they receive their acceptance packages. Without a valid visa, students may have to cancel their exchange semester at Sogang.</p>
Alien Registration	<p>Upon arrival, all exchange students must apply for Alien Registration. All foreigners intending to stay in Korea for more than 90 days are subject to Alien Registration. Sogang OIA will assist students with Alien Registration when the semester begins.</p>

Additional Information

Insurance	<p>All exchange students are required to submit a copy of insurance certificate that covers all medical costs, emergencies, and accidents during the period of their study at Sogang. Without a valid insurance certificate, student's enrollment at Sogang can be cancelled. It is important that students are covered by their insurance from their arrival date to departure date.</p>
Buddy Program	<p>Sogang has a student organization called Hands Up for Gathering (HUG). Buddies from HUG are Sogang students who help international students adjust smoothly into the life and culture of Korea. HUG organizes different field trips, parties, Korean language tutoring, and many cultural activities. Students can apply for the buddy program when submitting their online application for exchange.</p>
