【E】授業科目の目的と概要 Last Update Date : 2017-02-09

The emphasis of this course is to provide students opportunity to acquire basic skills for conversation, reading and writing necessary for daily student life in Japan. At the completion of this course, students should have acquired the second half of basic grammar and vocabulary. Students should also become able to read simple texts in Japanese. It includes the second half of basic grammar, vocabulary, and 172 kanji (in addition to 145 kanji at the level of first half of basic), as well as become able to read and write about 170 kanji. Teaching is done in Japanese whenever possible, starting from the first day. Class will be conducted based on various activities.
