	subject area at their home institution
Restrictions	\circ 6 is a final year undergraduate module (advanced) - modules at this
	level require students to have already taken 6-7+ modules in this
	subject area at their home institution
	• Modules with codes beginning with 7 are for postgraduate students only
	 Postgraduate students cannot take undergraduate modules
	- Students must also ensure that they meet all of the prerequisites listed on the
	module catalogue in order to be eligible to take intermediate and advanced
