Visa requirements	Student visa Students from Australia, Canada, Great Britain, Israel, Japan, New Zealand, South Korea or the United States, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco or San Marino can enter Germany without a visa. However, they are required to apply for a residence permit within three months of arriving in an EU country.

Housing

Accommodation	Student residences at Heidelberg University are administered by the <i>Studierendenwerk</i>, an independent organisation providing various services to the student population. Although the number of available rooms is quite limited (only ~15 per cent of all Heidelberg students can be housed in student residences), the <i>International Relations Office</i> cooperates with the <i>Studierendenwerk</i> to secure rooms in student residences for international exchange students coming to Heidelberg. Students usually stay in single rooms sharing kitchens and bathrooms in groups of 2 – 4, or in dormitories with kitchens and bathrooms on each floor. There is also a small number of single apartments available. The residences are located in different parts of the city and very close to public transport. Shopping areas are usually nearby.
