## Welcome to the Stockholm School of Economics

### Nomination and Application

Nominations will only be accepted through our official online form. The nomination link will be sent once the nomination period has opened. Please note that students that have not been nominated online will not be enrolled in our program.

**Timing:** The nomination deadline for our partner universities is April 1 for the fall semester and October 1 for the spring semester.

Once the nomination period is completed students will be invited to complete an online registration form to finalize their application.

## Academic Calendar

The Academic Year at SSE is divided into two semesters: a fall semester and a spring semester. Each semester is divided into two teaching periods, where periods one and two are during the fall semester, and periods three and four are in the spring semester. Exchange students can only apply to semesters, not periods; however, if you have students that are interested in only coming for one period, please contact the Exchange Office.

For incoming exchange students, the semester starts a couple of days earlier with a mandatory introduction to SSE, Stockholm and Sweden. For Fall Semester 2026 the Orientation Day will be on August 21, for Spring Semester 2027 it will be on January 18 (dates are subject to change).

### Examination dates

Examination dates can be found in the academic calendar and typically take place at the end of each teaching period.

## Academic Information

**English language requirements (effective for all new and renewed agreements from 2025 onward):** Students must demonstrate English language proficiency corresponding to at least a B2 level. It is the responsibility of the home university to ensure that students meet the requirements.

**Course Format:** Typically on site and in person. Exchange students are requested to stay until the end of their scheduled exams. No special early exams can be arranged.

Course registration will be open between May 6 - May 20 for the fall semester and November 26 - December 10 for the spring semester. These dates are subject to change and will be updated in the academic calendar.

**Workload:** Exchange students are able to take courses corresponding to 30 ECTS, i.e. 15 ECTS per teaching period. This typically amounts to two courses per teaching period.

**Transcripts:** Transcripts are available two months after the final exams. Students are invited to download their transcript directly on the internal portal. An original copy can be sent by post upon request.

## Practical Information

### Housing

At SSE, we have a small housing office that offers rooms and apartments to some of our international students. As there is no guarantee for housing, we recommend that you also explore other alternatives for accommodation. You can find more information [here](#)

### Cost of living

The following is a feasible monthly budget:

Housing: 6,000 – 10,000 SEK  
Food: 3,000 SEK  
Insurance: 300 SEK  
Hobbies: 2,000 SEK  
Local Transportation: 650 SEK

### Visa

It is very important that you purchase travel insurance that covers your trip and ensure that you have valid medical insurance covering your stay in Sweden. EU/EEA students should make sure they bring a [European Health Insurance Card](#) from their home countries or, alternatively, bring the terms and conditions for a fully comprehensive private health insurance policy.
