⑤ Acceptance Package

- The SKKU OIR will provide each accepted exchange and visiting student with an Acceptance Package, which includes the Certificate of Admission (CoA) and a Letter of Acceptance (LoA) required for visa applications.
- **Timeline (Expected)**
 Fall Semester: Late June to early July
 Spring Semester: Late December to early January
- **Important Condition for Issuance:** Please be advised that the timeline above applies only to students who have successfully submitted all required documents in their complete and final form.
- **Warning on Delays:** The issuance of the Acceptance Package is strictly contingent upon the verification of your documents. Any delay in submission or the submission of incomplete documents will directly result in a delay in the issuance of your package, which may subsequently affect your visa application schedule.

⑦ Expected Arrival Date

- **Early Arrival:** It is highly recommended that students arrive at SKKU a few days earlier than the orientation date.
- **Deadline:** If a student does not arrive in Korea by September 8th, his/her exchange program will automatically be cancelled.
- **Course Registration:** Please note that no additional course registration sessions will be provided for late arrivals, as the registration process is conducted entirely online.

- **Credit Transferability:** Students must consult with their home university regarding the compatibility and transferability of credits earned at SKKU, as the home institution holds the final authority over credit recognition.
- **Credit Definition:** To earn one (1) SKKU credit per semester, students must complete a minimum of 45 hours of study, which includes 15 hours of in-class instruction and 30 hours of individual self-study.

⑨ Maximum Credits & Credit Conversion

- **Maximum Credits:** 18 SKKU credits (Approximately 6~7 courses)
- **Credit Conversion & Transfer:** The credit transfer policy should be determined by the home institution.
- SKKU can provide supporting information and references for credit conversion and transfer.
- **Important Policies**
 - 1) As all exchange and visiting students are classified as undergraduate (bachelor's degree) students in the SKKU system, they must follow a separate procedure for enrolling in graduate-level classes.
 - 2) Details regarding graduate course enrollment will be announced during the course registration period.

- **Accommodation Availability:** Starting from the 2026 Academic Year, please be advised that dormitory placement may not be guaranteed for all exchange and visiting students due to high demand.
- **Off-campus Housing Support:** For students who are not assigned to a dormitory or prefer to live independently, basic tips and resources for finding private accommodation in Seoul will be provided.
- **Random Assignment:** Dormitories and room types are randomly assigned. Requests for changes are not accepted.
- **Campus Verification:** Before applying, students must verify the campus where their desired courses are held.
- **Payment Warning:** International wire transfers may take several days. Failure to remit the full fee by the deadline will result in automatic cancellation of the housing application.
- **Application Info:** Housing application details will be sent via email only to students who have successfully submitted all required admission documents.

⑭ Visa and Residence Card

■ Visa Requirements

- Visa Types: Exchange students must apply for a D-2-6 visa, and visiting students must apply for a D-2-8 visa.
- Pre-entry Application: Students must secure their D-2 visa in their home country before entering Korea.
- Important: SKKU is not responsible for any issues arising from entering Korea on a tourist visa (K-ETA).

■ Residence Card (formerly ARC)

- Application Methods: You may apply for your Residence Card individually or through a group application managed by the university's designated agency (Hire Diversity). Please note that agency fees may apply.
- Issuance Timeline: It typically takes about 45 days to receive the card. This timeline is subject to change by the Immigration Office and is the same for both individual and group applications.
- Travel Restrictions: If you leave Korea after entering on a D-2 visa before your Residence Card is issued, your visa will be automatically invalidated.
- International travel is only permitted after you have physically received your Residence Card. We strongly recommend planning trips after the midterm exams.

■ Visa Extensions

- Personal Extensions: Requests for visa extensions for personal reasons after the semester ends must be handled individually. The university does not provide administrative assistance for post-program extensions.

⑮ Mandatory Health Insurance: National Health Insurance Service (NHIS)

- In accordance with Korean law, all international students holding a D-2 visa are required to subscribe to the National Health Insurance (NHI).
- **Automatic Enrollment:** Enrollment occurs automatically once your Residence Card is issued. No separate application is required.
- **Monthly Premium:** Approximately USD 60 per month.
 - Note: This fee is billed monthly. Students do not need to take any initial action for enrollment.
- **Visa Restrictions:** Please be aware that failure to pay the monthly premiums may result in restrictions on visa extensions or other administrative disadvantages.
- **Supplemental Insurance:** Since the NHI may not cover all medical contingencies (e.g., specific emergencies or private hospital room charges), we strongly recommend maintaining personal full-coverage insurance during your stay.

⑯ Student Life & Buddy Program (SG MAPLE)

- The SKKU OIR and HI-Club (a student group supporting international students) manage a dedicated buddy program called SG MAPLE. This program is designed to help you settle into Korean life and build lasting friendships with SKKU students.
- Experience Korean Culture: Throughout the semester, you can participate in weekly or monthly cultural activities to experience various aspects of Korea.

㉑ SKKU ISS (International Summer Semester)

Description	<p>The SKKU International Summer Semester (ISS) is an annual 4-week summer program hosted at Sungkyunkwan University. Details about this year's program are available on the official website. Each year, the program brings together highly motivated students from partner universities around the world to study at SKKU's Seoul campus and engage in a vibrant international learning environment.</p> <p>ISS offers a wide range of courses taught in English by renowned professors from leading universities worldwide, covering diverse academic fields. Some courses incorporate field trips and experiential learning activities, allowing students to connect classroom knowledge with real-world contexts in Seoul and beyond. In addition to regular academic courses, the program also offers a Research Internship Track, through which students can join research laboratories at SKKU and work closely with faculty members on academic research projects.</p> <p>Beyond the classroom, students participate in various cultural activities designed to introduce Korean history, traditions, and contemporary culture, creating opportunities to experience Korea while building friendships with peers from around the world. Exchange students are eligible for a 100% tuition scholarship, meaning that tuition fees are waived. (Please note that cultural activity fees may still apply.)</p>

㉒ SKKU WISE (Winter International Student Experience)

Description	<p>The SKKU Winter International Student Experience (WISE) is an annual 3-week winter program held from late December to early January. Details about this year's program are available on the official website. Similar to the summer program, WISE combines academic coursework with cultural experiences, offering students a unique opportunity to study in Korea during the winter season. Courses are delivered primarily by distinguished SKKU professors in an intensive 12-day format, allowing students to engage deeply with their subjects while experiencing campus life at SKKU. In addition to the academic program, students can participate in a range of cultural activities designed to introduce Korean history, traditions, and contemporary culture. Exchange students are eligible for a 100% tuition scholarship, meaning that tuition fees are waived. (Please note that cultural activity fees may still apply.)</p>
